

UNIFORM

1. Uniform Philosophy:

Balnarring District Netball Club (BDNC):

- Unapologetically encourages diversity and inclusion through offering choice in the uniform range
- Proudly acknowledges our Traditional Owners by incorporating and wearing Bunurong artwork every match. This artwork was gifted to the BDNC by Adam Magennis.
- Applies minimal uniform 'mark-up' to remove financial barriers for participation
- Endeavour to have minimal uniform design changes to ensure clothes are able to be handed down.
- Require all players to purchase their uniform from BDNC to ensure consistency of colour and design. Players must ensure they have the correct uniform prior to the commencement of the season.
- Offers new and second-hand uniforms for purchase during Wednesday night training from the Uniform Coordinator.
- Accepts payment by EFTPOS or on-line banking only (no cash).

2. NETSETGO uniform:

- Net Set Go top provided as part of the membership and can be worn to program sessions, or alternative generic sport attire can be worn.
- Sports shoes

3. PLAYER Uniform:

Game

- Option 1: BDNC playing dress with black or navy sports briefs
- Option 2: BDNC playing top with a choice of:
 - Navy blue sports skirt (no zips or pockets)
 - Navy blue shorts, plain, mid-thigh, with no pockets
 - The Navy skirt, shorts and sports briefs can be sourced from any retailer.
- Sports shoes and white socks.

Training

- BDNC uniform, or a training top can be used for training sessions (club preference)
- Other generic sporting attire can be worn to training
- Sports shoes

4. Club Dress Code

- No jewellery to be worn (medical alert bracelets/chains must be securely taped with strapping tape).
- Earrings may be worn provided they are taped with thick, brown, fabric, strapping tape.
- No gloves may be worn (unless required for a medical condition).

- Nails must be cut short or taped (with strapping tape) in accordance with rules of Association where match is played.
- Hats and sunscreen required when outdoors.
- Hair must be tied back if long.
- Players must bring their own drink bottle.

5. BDNC merchandise

Additional BDNC merchandise is available to be purchased. Items include sports socks, drink bottles, jumpers, jackets and bags. The BDNC philosophy is to apply minimal 'mark up' to merchandise to remove financial barriers.

6. Lost property

Property left at the BDNC clubrooms after a training session will be kept in the Lost Property tub. Any items that have not been collected by the end of each year will be taken to the Op Shop or disposed of.

7. Second hand uniforms

BDNC facilitate the sale of second-hand dresses at no cost to the community. Payments are by cash only. Please see the Uniform Coordinator for more information and current stock.

8. Free items

BDNC facilitates donated second-hand uniform by having a 'Free to Good Home' tub which is available to community members in the clubrooms.
